Four encouraging sessions address these important questions:

What is Our Source of Life?

Though we live in the here and now, our life is found in another kingdom. In this new kingdom, we learn to walk as "poor in spirit," drawing all of our life from God.

How Do We Change?

God has given us a new heart that has been cleansed from all sin. He sets before us a lifestyle that is focused upon fulfilling His will, a lifestyle which also satisfies our souls.

Can We Live Without Shame?

God removes guilt and fear, enabling us to love Him in return, free from condemnation and regrets. He leads us continually in triumph in Christ.
